
SUBJECT: Summer2020 SemesteEnrollment Report

The headcount enrollmentor the 26 institutions of the University Symm of Georgia in Symmer 2020 was 165,801, an increase of 8.8

- x FTE enrollment increased 12.7 percent at research universities 1.0 percent at comprehensive universities 5.5 percent atstate universities and 10.2 percent atstate colleges.
- x Dual enrollment decreased by 3.8 percent from 2,397 in Summer 20th 2,306 in Summer 2020. This is the second decrease in summer dual enrollment row.
- x Undergraduate enrollment increased & percent \$,251 students) over Summer 291 and graduate enrollment increased14y1 percent \$,993 students). Most of the graduate enrollment growth(63 percent)ccurred at Georgia Tech, \$161 student.
- x Transient student enrollmenteclined by 1,001 or 18.9 percent This is likely due to students being able to take almost all class their home institution.
- x New student enrollment changes:
 - o Beginning freshman enrollmendecreasedby 10.0 percent (392 students) from 3,916students in Summer 209 to 3,524 Summer 2020.
 - o New undergraduateransfers decreased by 25 percent (174 students) rom 3,367 students in Summer 2019 o 3,193 in Summer 2020
 - o New graduatestudent enrollment increased by 16.3 percent (632 students) from 3,887 students in Summer 2019 to 4,519 inu8 nmer 2020.
- x Enrollment changes by race/ethnicity
 - o Asian student enrollmenincreased by 23.6 percent \$,692 students) Much of this growth was at Georgia ech(2,429 students) Asian students nade up11.7 percent of all students in Summer 2020, up from 10.3 percent the pair summer
 - o Hispanic studentenrollment increasedy 15.4 percent (1,972 students). Hispanic studentsmade up8.9 percent of all students Summer 2020 compared to8.4 percent in Summer 2019.
 - o African American student enrollment increased by 7.0 percent (2,765 students) compared to Summer 29.1 In Summer 2020, African American students represented 25.5 percent of all students down from 25.9 percent in 3 mmer 2019.
 - o White/non-Hispanic student enrollmeintcreased by 5.7 percent(4,317 students). White/non-Hispanic students represented 0.0 percent of all students Summer 2020, down from 49.4 percentin Summer 209.
- x In-state enrollment as a share of overall enrollment declined from \$2.7.4 percent he share of students hat are out of state residents increased from 1.2 to 11.8 percent

however, the percent out-of-statestudents with utition waived decreased from 38 to 22.2 percent. The share of out-of-country enrollees increased from 1 to 6.8 percent. The percent out-of-country students with tuition waived decrease from 41.0 to 35.0 percent.

- x Female enrollmen(198,479) remains substantially higher than male enrollme(167,322) in Summer 2020. Female enrollment increased by 10.0 percent from Summer 209 to Summer 2020 (8,937 students), while male enrollment increased 7.1 percent (4,489 students).
- x The number of nontraditionalged undergraduate studsein the systemincreasedby 4.5 percent from 14,366 in Summer 2019 to 15,007 in Summer 2020 This reverses along trend of decreases in all summer terms since 2012 except one Also, the average age of undergradute students increased slightly from 23.4 to 23.5 The average age for graduate students increased from 33.0 to 33.4
- x The
